

Over Christmas we raised funds for our mission partners in Malawi to provide much needed medication for young children with insulin dependent Type 1 diabetes. £50 provides a year of treatment for one child. ELLON AND DISTRICT MEN'S SHED

HOSPITAL ROAD, ELLON, AB41 9AW


Men's Sheds are now springing up in many UK communities: Men's Sheds are simply a place where men can socialise with kindred spirits, while having the opportunity to learn new skills and practice old ones. Men's Sheds aim to help mainly retired men by preventing isolation and loneliness, improving social interaction and enabling them to enjoy an active, healthy and meaningful retirement. This has a positive payback to their families and the wider community, who will also benefit from the activities they undertake and the skills they possess.

The Shed is not all workshop activities; just come along for a cuppa, put the world to rights, read the newspapers, play games and meet other men.

As well as retired men, current membership includes offshore shift workers, unemployed men and men who are recovering from illness, bereavement and depression. Our Shed is funded entirely by charity and managed by 9 volunteer trustee members. Membership is free to all men over 16 and many men have now joined, with some coming regularly and others just occasionally. We have a 15-year lease from the Aberdeenshire Council for the old recycling shed and adjacent land in Hospital Road, Ellon. Through funding of over £60k and help from local builders and suppliers, we converted the old shed into a very suitable workshop with the majority of equipment being donated by local residents and our kitchen and carpeting donated and fitted by local businesses. Shadow tool boards are installed in the workshop so that all tools are easily found for use and can be put back in their right place. In addition, a social area with kitchen, office and toilets has been created. with a model railway also under construction here.

We have 2 outdoor containers for material storage and gardening



This has given a real boost to our campaigning work, helping us promote Fairtrade goods from footballs to fusilli and coffee to crafts. By buying Fairtrade goods we can all do a little bit to redress the inequalities in the trading world and help tackle poverty in some of the poorest countries.

This Spring we have lots more activities to tell you about as Fairtrade Fortnight comes round again. Thanks to our Co-op Community fund bonus we are able to offer special deals to local schools and other groups on the purchase of Fairtrade footballs. 3 primary schools in the area have already taken up this offer and another 2 schools are hosting a visit from Just Trading Scotland who are urging us to take on the Fairtrade rice challenge. The profits made by Fairtrade producers in Malawi from selling 90 kgs. of their rice can fund the cost of sending a Malawian child to school for a year. Hopefully our community can meet the challenge of selling the 90kgs., via the schools and other groups.

And by special request we are rerunning the Fairtrade Cafe Crawl this year from 16th February - 10th March. It was so successful last vear that it is being extended across Aberdeenshire this year with cafes in the Peterhead. Alford and Huntly areas taking part as well. Just go to any of the cafes in the poster featured here, order a Fairtrade drink and pick up a Fairtrade Cafe Crawl card. Each coffee or tea purchased between 16th February and 10th March earns you a stamp on your card and 10 stamps wins you a large free bar of Fairtrade chocolate. So you can help other people, enjoy a coffee with friends and win a bar of chocolate all at the same time

And finally on Sunday,4th March, make a point of going to the community film evening at the Victoria hall in Ellon. Members of our community have been busy over the past few months:

Tarves School pupils hoped to plant 25 new fruit trees, partly funded by the Tree Council, at our 'Dick's Way' orchard. Unfortunately, this activity had to be cancelled due to the poor weather in the weeks before Christmas. Members of the Amenities group planted 24 of the trees over the festive season with one held back to be planted by the children in the next few weeks.

Our Christmas lights display was magnificent as ever. Thanks to Haddo Estate for providing the tree and our eager band of volunteers for their dedication to the village. A response has been submitted to Aberdeenshire Council objecting to the proposal to charge communities for electricity and pole inspections in future.

The Formartine Partnership continue to prepare the first draft of our Community Action Plan.

The surfacing work at the MUGA (Multi-Use Games Area) has been completed; the repairs to the lighting system remains outstanding.

Repairs to the roof of the school and walls have been completed.

Community Council members received many comments regarding the conditions of the pavements during the cold spell in December. A big 'thank you' to one of our members, Ian Massie, who took it upon himself to clear the snow from pavements. Unfortunately, the continual thaw and freeze did not help and created unsafe walking conditions. Following a request by the Community Council, additional grit bins have since been provided within the village and we have also secured a suitable trailer to enable the pavements around the village to be gritted. A grant application has been submitted by our Development Trust to the council requesting they contribute towards the cost of pavement clearing equipment.

We continue to press Scotland Superfast for updates on Openreach's plan for the provision of fibre broadband to rural Tarves.

Scotia Homes anticipate holding a public consultation meeting at the end of April regarding the site next to the Bancon development.

of this fantastic achievement. Not only have they put physical education and sport at the heart of their school and local community, but they have managed to do so in a way that encourages all pupils to take part in physical activity whilst having fun at the same time."

The award was only possible due to the commitment of parents and members of the community in offering after-school activities such as football, bikeability, triathlon training and netball. We are also proud of the pupils who enthusiastically participate in activities such as cricket and judo during school time. We take part in the 'Daily Mile' each morning to promote fitness, health and wellbeing. Our Physical Education lessons are progressive and give our children the opportunity to develop a range of skills and experience a number of different sports. Thank you to all who work so tirelessly for our pupils.

Jammin' Fitness

Barthol Chapel was fortunate to welcome Andy McKechnie into school. Andy is an international motivational speaker and a former Junior Chamber International



world public speaking champion. He hosted an amazing 'Jammin Fitness' workshop for the pupils – his unique blend of storytelling and multicultural dance provided an inspirational morning. Andy also talked about the importance of physical exercise and maintaining a positive self-image. It was an important message presented in a winning way.

Terrific Scientific

Barthol Chapel School will again be taking part in real life scientific studies. The children have investigated whether a child's geographical location and the type of surface they walk on (manmade vs. natural) affects their feet flexibility. It's thought that in the last 200 years our feet have started to adapt to changes in lifestyle and small studies suggest that foot flexibility varies significantly between rural and urban areas. We are working with the University of Kent on this investigation.

We have also completed a twoweek challenge, in conjunction with the University of Edinburgh, to investigate the power used by our school. We then looked for ways to improve our efficiency, find ways to change our behaviours and reduce our use of electricity.


