Hello everyone

Welcome to this online edition of the March 2021 TBC newsletter. Under present Covid-19 health/safety circumstances, we can't unfortunately print and deliver as usual, but hope you'll take the time to read it in a different way.

All going well, our youngest age groups of village children will be back at school/nursery on Monday 22 February for more than the standard practice of education. There are old friendships to renew and new friendships to create, games times, assembly times, break times and school lunch hour, all of which provide the time to redevelop what they have missed over the periods of lockdown. We as adults, know what it feels like to maintain our friendships through phone calls, WhatsApp, Zoom and the ultimate 'write a letter to a friend'. Children are sociable little souls, if there is someone in the playpark they'll play together, and only at the end of playtime will they find out each other's names. It's been a pleasure to be out in the village and see children making the most of daylight and playtime – and a well done to the parents for taking them and waiting in the frequently cold days just so they could be outside burning off unspent energy.

I have 2 grandsons who live in the East Midlands and both miss school and friendships hugely My contact with them is via Royal Mail and Zoom – now this is where children's IT skills show me up. However, behind the scenes teachers have been working hard to maintain classroom learning in a home setting, and we have a selection of thoughts from

Tarves schoolchildren. Thank you to both school and parents for encouraging them to submit to the TBC and it's a privilege being able to include them today. The front cover with Fergus' words is a reminder that there are 'brighter times ahead', so when these brighter days do come around, there is also a personalised Tarves Trails feature giving you local walking routes and a clear reminder that:

'We are so lucky to have these great walks on our doorsteps. Go and explore!'

There are a few other features in the TBC this time, offering links and phone numbers to various agencies that offer help after the difficult times we have had. Aberdeenshire Council are offering online Power Tools workshops on learning, personal growth and mental health and wellbeing. Another course of 'Realising your potential' is on offer for Spring 2021. NHS Grampian have a Psychological Resilience Hub with contact details on how they can help both adults and children. I am waiting on a supply of leaflets from Aberdeenshire Council on various forms of help and general information within the Formartine are; these will go in the Spar and Pharmacy.

Tarves Heritage keep copies of all TBCs ever published and this one will be added to the box of 'Tarves History', so in years ahead locals and visitors alike can reflect on how our Parish managed during this last year and for the rest of this year too. Dear Friends

This has been a hard winter for everyone with another lockdown on top of the snow and ice. The church buildings are closed again for everything except funerals, and even these services are subject to tight restrictions. We have no indication of when the buildings might open again, but we continue our weekly services of worship on Zoom at 10.00am on a Sunday. This is made possible thanks to an amazing team of people, who generously offer their musical, creative and technical gifts so generously. If you have not tried it yet, why not join us some Sunday? You can join on-line or by telephone and we will talk you through the technology – please e-mail or telephone me or any of the elders for the link/phone number. We can even organise a practice run of a Zoom meeting if that would be helpful.

Children and families might like to know that we are publishing a weekly Story, Activity and Simple Craft on our Messy Church Facebook page. If you would like a box of craft materials to help with these, we are happy to supply this – just get in touch through the Facebook page or contact me directly.

We continue to be involved with the local care for the community project in Tarves. Thanks to all those who continue to contribute so generously to this work and to the local shops for continuing to act as collection points.

As some of you will be aware changes of a radical nature are taking place in the Church of Scotland at present. Over the next 5 years many ministers will reach retirement and fewer people have been entering ministry to replace them. As a result, consultation has been carried out with local Kirk Sessions to try and find new ways of ensuring that despite this reduction in ministers, local worshipping and witnessing communities can continue, and indeed, we would hope and pray, grow.

Recently our local Presbytery of Gordon produced a draft plan which envisages teams of ministers working together to cover groups of congregations and parishes throughout Presbytery. The proposed grouping for our area is Barthol Chapel, Tarves, Methlick and Udny Pitmedden. Exactly how the different groupings in Presbytery will work in practice will vary from place to place as the

local congregations get to know one another and learn to share their different gifts and talents, as well as their ministers.

As congregations we have all been working together for some time on the Formartine Youth Project. However, we do look forward to working more closely with our neighbours in the future. You will see that we are planning a new united initiative at Easter with a series of short evening services on Zoom throughout Holy Week to which all are welcome. The link will be available from myself or any of the elders nearer the time.

Once again, thank you all for your continued support throughout this difficult and challenging time.

Tribute to Harry Bichard

Dr Harry Thomas Alfred Bichard was a loving husband to Susanna, a father to George, a Pop to grandson Stanley, and a friend to many within the local community. Often recognisable by his Breton Cap, Harry was understated but always a gentleman. Originally hailing from Dundee, a career in the RAF, an accomplished musician, and as a teacher brought Harry around the world and the UK, before he eventually settled back in Scotland.

He liked to use his time well, approaching tasks with thoughtfulness and consideration. Be it his music; his stained glass making, which has found a home in many locations around the world; his delicious cappuccinos; or his equally delicious cooking.

Harry possessed a genuine curiosity and interest in the world around him. He never lost his drive to bring out the best in others, particularly young people. Whether in his teacher guise or not, those lucky enough to become his "pal" could expect a non-judgmental ear, patience, and some wise words or a humorous anecdote.

It was around the age of 13 that I first met Harry. Armed with a turquoise saxophone, something he never stopped poking fun at, he gave me my first lessons. In all honesty, I was not the most studious of saxophonists. Yet he always knew when to encourage and when to listen. Over the last twenty years, long after I last gave my saxophone a toot, that is what he continued to do. I suspect Harry's compassion had a long-lasting impact on those he befriended throughout his life. So, on behalf of all your pals Harry, a heartfelt thank you.



Farewell to Peter and Jennie Chalmers







We were able to share knitting through December 2020, before the lockdown prevented further deliveries. Woodend Hospital were delighted with a big box of 20 blankets and these would be shared between Orthopaedics, Neurology and Ortho Rehab wards.



The Labour Ward in ARI sent their thanks with the message below for the donations in November/December 2020:

These are going to be handed out as Christmas gifts to all the babies born over the festive period. Every new-born is given a gift to take home and parents are always very appreciative of the efforts made by our kind volunteers.

Early January 2021, 5 large bags of assorted baby knitting went across to Gemma at Ardlethen Quarry in Ellon. She co-ordinates the knitting for the Special Care Baby Unit in Aberdeen, plus other maternity units in NHS Grampian and they will all benefit from dozens of baby bonnets, lovely baby blankets and little cardigans with matching hats.

New babies born in Tarves are also given gifts from the knitting collection, the knitters were so pleased that these babies had their very own 'Tarves Knitters' contribution and this plan will continue throughout the remainder of this year.

Time is catching up. We celebrate our 90th anniversary in June and we intend to use a member's garden as the venue – subject to Covid restrictions.


All in all, zoom meetings are working for us as an alternative for the short term. Hopefully this summer will see a return to normal face to face meetings.

Appeal for Nkhoma Hospital - March/April 2021

Many of you will be familiar with Nkhoma Hospital through all the knitting sent from this Parish over the past few years. We have just heard that the hospital is facing a desperate situation with the Covid-19 pandemic.

Prior to Christmas the country was seeing an average of 0-3 cases per day. On 20 January there were 1,000 cases just on that day. Two cabinet ministers have died of Covid over the past 2 weeks. The country is overwhelmed and is without adequate equipment, medications, or oxygen. The anti-viral treatments and the vaccines available here in the USA or UK, are not available at all in Malawi. Nkhoma is facing great difficulty in affording and obtaining what is available.

The staff are stressed and overwhelmed. Even when funds are available, sourcing the supplies and oxygen is difficult as the demand is outstripping the supply, especially with oxygen. Ventilators are not an option as there are probably less than 20, if that, country wide, and none at Nkhoma.

Barthol Chapel Community Association News

On behalf of the BCCA we would like to thank everyone who came to our online AGM. It was very heartening to have so much support and we gave a big thank you to our outgoing committee members for their hard work. We are pleased to say that we have a full complement of office bearers and a good number who have volunteered to come on to the committee as community members- so we are in good shape.

Our new treasurer has set to work immediately, getting funds from Aberdeenshire Council to set up a business account with zoom for our meetings for the foreseeable future.

We followed the AGM with an Ordinary meeting and as we can't organise any physical events yet with any certainty, the main topic was the local internet speeds!

In February, we re-ran a survey to see if internet connectivity has improved since the last survey in 2014. Overall, average download speeds have improved to 10 Mbps from 1.3 Mbps. This increase is driven by the use of 4G which now accounts for 47% of all connections, with an average download speed of 19 Mbps. If you want to use 4G, try EE as speeds are a lot better than other providers; however it depends on getting an EE signal at your house. When looking at traditional broadband speeds alone, there is a marginal increase to 1.6 Mbps (up from 1.3 Mbps) which is still very poor in today's connected economy (and recent work / study from home requirements) and a long way from the Scottish Government's R100 target."

We also had a report from Doug and Stephen about their progress with setting up a Community Fibre Partnership with Openreach. Last year, 35 properties responded and registered an interest in the scheme. Openreach can only work with one exchange and the majority are on the Methlick exchange, so this is the one they are happy to progress with. The cost of bringing fibre into people's houses would be shared between Openreach and the community. There are various grants that should cover the costs. There are still more properties in the area that could benefit from the scheme and when more detailed surveys and costs have been confirmed, further work will be done to encourage more people in the area to register.

The state of the surfaces of local roads was also discussed and a suggestion made by Paul Johnston to go to either Aberdeenshire Council's website or Fix my Street FixMyStreet to register any repairs needed.

We would like to thank the Scottish Government for their resilience grant and the Robertson Trust operational funding that has ensured our survival.



Our role at the Hub is to offer a support mechanism for who may feel overwhelmed, upset or personally affected by the current situation with Covid-19. This is totally understandable. As we all go through this abnormal and unknown situation due to Covid-19 it is normal to experience abnormal or upsetting emotions. The Hub has been set up to offer you some extra support and advice to manage at this time if you are affected by Covid-19 in any way. This includes:

- · Any member of public from anywhere in Grampian or Orkney
- All staff from Health & Social Care Partnerships in Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire or Moray
- All NHS staff in Grampian who are not based in Acute covid wards at ARI (a separate service exists for them)
- All Scottish Ambulance Staff (SAS) from Grampian, Highland, Orkney, Shetland and Western Isles
- · All Care Home staff, nursing home staff, community support staff, and home-carers
- All staff that work in the 3rd Sector or private care providers

You can self-refer in to the Hub and will receive up to three sessions of support based on the principles of psychological first aid. This can be seen here:

The service is open 7 days a week from 8am to 8pm. A clinician will call you back on the phone or offer a virtual appointment within a few days of you contacting out Hub.

Lentil Soup

Here is a simple Lentil Soup recipe which can easily be made by children with a little help from Dad or Mum.

Allergens - Celery (contained in Stock Cubes)

- Lentils 150 grams or a cup (washed and drained)
- Mixed Vegetables 250 grams equivalent to 1 med carrot, 1 med potato, this can be a mix of turnip, carrots, potatoes & leeks - chopped (fresh or frozen)
- Onion 1 medium sized Diced
- Stock 2 cubes Vegetable, Chicken or Ham
- Water 1 Litre or 2 pints
- Salt and pepper to taste

Method

- 1.Put all the ingredients (vegetables, lentils, stock cubes and water) in a pan.
- 2.Bring to the boil, cover then simmer, stirring occasionally for approx. 45 minutes until lentils and vegetables are soft.
- 3. Season to taste.
- 4. Serve chunky or purée the soup using either a stick blender or a potato masher.
- 5. Serve with crusty bread or a cheese scone (see recipe below) for a filling lunch.

You can make many variations to this simple lentil soup by adding items like bacon, a touch of curry powder, parsley or other spices along with lots of other vegetables.
